BY-LAWS OF THE PETERBOROUGH MOTOR SPORTS CLUB, INC. Article 1 - Duties of the Officers

Section 1-President

The President will preside at all regular, annual and committee meetings and conduct them in accordance with parliamentary authority named in Article 7 of the By-laws. The President shall sign all official documents and countersign all cheques. The President, as chief executive officer, shall supervise the club's affairs and activities.

Section 2 - Vice President

The Vice President shall assume all of or part of the responsibilities of the President, in the absence of the President. The Vice President shall be responsible for the promotion and maintenance of membership.

Section 3 - Secretary

The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings and shall keep the records in accordance with the parliamentary authority named in Article Seven (7) of the By-laws. The Secretary shall prepare the minutes for publication in the bulletin each month.

Section 4 - Treasurer

The Treasurer shall responsible for the collection of membership dues and other income, and for keeping all financial books and records. The Treasurer shall disburse funds at the direction of the executive committee and sign all cheques.

Section 5 - Competition Director

The Competition Director shall be responsible for recruiting organizers for all PMSC events and keeping a record of all competition points and standings. These shall be published in the Bulletin and on the Clubs web site on a regular basis. The director may recruit committee members as necessary, and shall be responsible for each event's compliance with current club rules and regulations.

Section 6–Communications Director.

Publish a club Bulletin a minimum of four times annually.

Bulletin will at a minimum include Summary of PMSC Business meetings, since previous publication. Club Calendar. Club Competition Points.

Promote the club via any media available. Oversee published content web site, Forum etc. Work with event Organizers to promote events.

Section 7- Director at Large

Coordinate social meetings. Coordinate special events.

Carry out special assignments as requested by the Board.

Section 8 - Past President

The Past President shall act as an advisor to the executive, coordinating the activities of the past and current year.

- pay \$10 for a one-day licence

Jenny Gulliver spent time touring in New Zealand.
While there, Pete picked up a rally magazine aptly named "A
Little Bit Sideways". He found this article about a classic Kiwi
motoring event... "The Gumboot Rally".



Whilst not strictly rallying in the sense that we know it, rally enthusiasts Andy, Kie and Gator decided to drive the Forgotten Highway. A few friends were invited along, and The Gumboot Rally was from.

This is not a race. It's held on public roads, and all road rules must be obeyed. The organisers will penalise you for arriving ahead of the "safe arrival time" and you will not be eligible for any prizes if you receive a speeding ticket during the event. It's about like-minded people having a good time in their cars.

Join Obsessive Car Detailing's Managing Director, Christian Taylor, as he writes about the latest rally, held on 28th April 2017. There was something special happening in Tauranga over the weekend; and all the stars turned out! The Gumboot Rally was in town, and the theme was Hollywood. We had actors and actresses, members of the 1930's press, and even Kermit the Frog. We were lucky enough to join them for a weekend of driving and challenges across the North Island of New Zealand, and what an experience it was!

With seven events already under their collective belt, it's no surprise the latest Gumboot Rally was an outstanding hit.

Coming from grass-roots NZ motorsport beginnings, the Gumboot Rally founders Andy, Gator and Mikey have all attended the large international car rallies — and came together five years ago with the common feeling that the focus has been lost in these rallies.

Rather than simply let this feeling go, they opted to do something about it; and the Gumboot Rally was born. Put simply in two words, the Gumboot Rally is about People and Driving.

It could be seen as a motto or a mantra; but however way you look at it, these two words mean wonders when it comes to running an event like the Gumboot. And therein lies the main drawcard for returning die-hards like myself who have yet to miss a Gumboot Rally.

Covering over 1,000kms of the best driving roads in New Zealand, the driving aspect of each rally is thrilling. From rolling hills to back country straightaways and winding farmland, the differing assortment of countryside was immense, and there truly was a little for every enthusiast in this, the eighth rally.

High levels of preparation and thought are put into the route by the trio – and they succeeded again in finding simply the best driving roads our country has to offer, and some of NZ's most amazing scenery.

This was heightened by the secrecy

the mission pack detailing the
challenges and route are not
released to participants until the
driver's briefing on the day of the
event.

Much thought is put into making the rally attractive to all – for areas of loose terrain such as gravel (still quite common on our NZ back country roads), the route is raised at the briefing, and an alternative route is always provided.

For many, the gravel sections are quite the highlight!





















The types of challenges encountered, were looking for a Marvel character under the bridge over the Rauokore River, or jotting down the year of the Ford Laser parked alongside Te Pula Springs Station.

The people certainly make this event – described simply by Duncan Bennett in the rapid Audi S3 hatch: "Good people, good times". And he's right.

Enthusiasts from all walks of life, driving all types of vehicles and supporting all kinds of manufacturers, are brought together for the sole purpose of driving.

This is not a motorsport event, and a fast car is not required. Never in all my years as a car enthusiast have I seen such a diverse group of enthusiasts brought into a melting pot with such positive results.

Friendships have been formed between young and old, die-hard V8 drivers and Japanese hatch fans, all and sundry. They all do the same drive, the same challenges – and all look forward to sharing stories together at the end of each day.

Some of the more interesting vehicles in this year's event included a classic box Lada, an Aston Martin Vantage, an RX7, and a hoard of various-generation Ford Escorts.

The event couldn't go ahead without the support from its sponsors, and the Gumboot Rally have been very lucky in acquiring a number of longstanding sponsors over the course of their eight events.

This year, Natalle "Charlle", Ryan "Maverick" and Logan "Goose" - Team Top Gun took out the coveted Overall Winner, and what a fantastic effort!

These guys rocked their theme all weekend and really got amongst it. Plus, they managed to score the most points. They took away some awesome Milwaukee cordless tools and have had their name engraved on the coveted Gumboot Rally Champion shield.

Obsessive Car Detailing Ltd (shameless free plug) offered the Too Clean for Gumboot award to the stunning Aston Martin Vantage, which barely looked like it had competed by the end!

The not-so-coveted "Kick up the Ass" award was received this year by yours truly for an error of judgement involving a rather large (and certainly mobile) rock; a stratospheric fall from grace after our first-place finish at the inaugural Gumboot!

Communications Director Year End Report, November 22, 2017

It has been my honour to serve as your Communications Director and Bulletin Editor for the calendar years 2016 and 2017. My term expires at the end of 2017 and I have already stated my intention to step down and not run for re-election/appointment to the position.

The Bulletin

During this year, we have published 9 editions of The Bulletin each month except for July and September, averaging nearly 11 pages per edition. Articles have included reviews of cars/trucks, promotion and results of events, reviews of events attended by members, and various articles related to motor sports and motoring in general.

We will also publish an 10th edition in December, which will include the minutes of the Annual General Meeting and the annual reports of the Executive Committee.

We send out, via email each month more than 90 copies of the Bulletin to members, several former members, interested individuals and the local media.

I have curated Bulletin editions in paper copies from 2011 through to 2017 and have or will save them in electronic versions to add to the 2009-2010 bulletin digital editions created by former Bulletin Editor Mark Newell.

News Releases

Thus far we have sent out, via email, 10 news releases in 2017 to all local print, broadcast media and our members. We will send out releases regarding the AGM results and will preview the Awards night in January. We have received good coverage from the Examiner, occasional use of our releases from Peterborough This Week and area online publications. Radio stations Extra 90.5 and Country 105 have occasionally used our releases for broadcast.

Twitter

We have 62 followers and we follow 85 other Twitter feeds, mainly from other motorsports related entities and local media and police authorities. In 2017, "Motormouth" and others with access to the account have tweeted or retweeted reminders of events, results, meetings, club related news and profiles. In late 2010 when we started the Twitter feed, we had nine followers and followed 15. We have tweeted nearly 553 times since then.

Facebook

Our Facebook page has 331 members. When the page started in 2011, we had 75 members. It is a good way to keep members informed of club events, meetings, issues and event results.

Website

Your Communications Director, with the help of Matt Ballinger and the Word Press online tutorial lessons, assumed the content upkeep of the www.pmsc.on.ca website in 2017. On the site are entry forms, membership application forms, the PMSC Constitution and a *Bulletin* archive. I have posted information in the "News" section of upcoming events, including this meeting and the agenda, proxy and minutes of meetings along with the results of recent events.

I await our 2018 event schedule to post.

Conclusion

As I wrote in my 2016 report, I have found it very time consuming and mentally taxing to juggle of all these "flaming chainsaws". I strongly recommend the next Communications Director concentrate on news releases, social media and the Website.

That is why I am supporting the motion to delete the portion of the By-Laws which stipulates the publication of a minimum of four issues of *The Bulletin*. This could mean an end to a six-decade tradition of publishing a

Bulletin (But it leaves the door open to continue publishing).

So as the country song's lyrics go, "There's a Last Time for Everything".

If the membership approves, the December 2017 edition could very well be the last, perhaps forever.
